

How National Nurses United (NNU) Spends Members' Hard-Earned Money

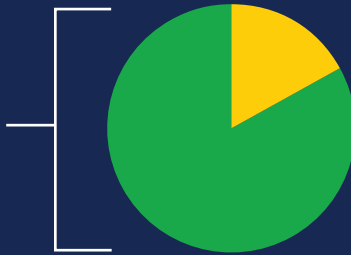


Employees paid NNU nearly \$14 million in the form of dues, fees and per capita taxes during the last federal filing year.¹

But **ONLY 17¢ of every \$1.00** it collected was spent on “Representational Activities” – the reason employees pay a union.

NNU spent more than \$4.5 million of the nearly \$14 million it collected on running its business, mostly the salaries and benefits for union leaders and direct union employees.

NNU’s constitution says its dues can be as high as **\$1,404 a year** for full-time RNs²



If you paid that amount, only about **\$238.68** would go to representing you and your colleagues.

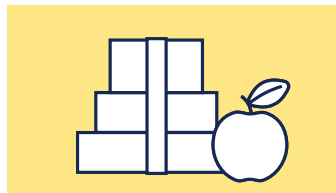


Here are a few of the ways NNU spends dues money:
