Strikes are not inevitable, but if the union can't get what it wants during contract negotiations, it might decide to take associates out of the hospital and away from patients.

409 days on strike

Over **770,000** workdays lost

Here are some things to consider when thinking about strikes:

- Patients could suffer because caregivers they depend on are away from the bedside.
- Associates don't typically get paid by their employer while on strike.
- Associates may have to cover some health insurance costs, depending on the terms of the plan.
- You may not be able to use PTO, depending on the terms of the plan.
- Striking associates are not entitled to receive unemployment benefits in Colorado.

Be fully informed about how a strike could impact you.
